**Paul Zykofsky, AICP**

Paul Zykofsky, AICP, Associate AIA, has been director of land use and transportation programs at the Local Government Commission and has managed its Center for Livable Communities since 1995. Mr. Zykofsky has experience in land-use, air quality, transportation planning and health and the built environment. He is co-author of documents on transit-oriented development, street design, walkability and traffic calming. Mr. Zykofsky is a frequent presenter at local, regional and national conferences and has experience facilitating workshops, design charrettes and planning processes. He is nationally certified to facilitate Safe Routes to School workshops and teaches the FHWA's Designing for Pedestrian Safety and Pedestrian Safety Action Plan courses. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners, an Associate Member of the American Institute of Architects and a member of the Congress for the New Urbanism.
